You can survive an ACTIVE

SHOOTER

If you find yourself in harm's way, take fast and decisive action.

RUN.

If a safe path is available, RUN:

- · Do not hesitate; get out
- Leave your belongings
- Prevent others from entering the area
- · Call 9-1-1 when you are safe

HIDE.

If you can't get out safely, HIDE:

- Stay out of the shooter's view and be quiet
- · Silence your phone
- Lock/barricade doors
- Call 9-1-1 when you are safe

FIGHT.

As a last resort, FIGHT:

- Fight with an all-out commitment
- · Be physically aggressive
- Use improvised weapons
- Fight to incapacitate the shooter
