SATURDAY 2ND & THURSDAY 21ST – 9:30 AM “SEA TURTLE EXPLORATION”– Explore the seashore. Discuss our nesting season. Walk for fun and exercise. Discover the diversity and beauty of the various plants and animals inhabiting the barrier island. Bring water, sunscreen and repellent. Meet at the Eddy Creek Pavilion. (1 hour)

FRIDAY, 8TH – 9:00 AM “SEMINOLE REST WALK”– Enjoy a stroll with a ranger. Walk for fun and exercise. Discover the diversity and beauty of the various plants, animals and pollinators inhabiting Seminole Rest. Bring your camera if you wish. Bring water, sunscreen and repellent. Meet at the Seminole Rest parking area (210 River Rd., Oak Hill). (1 hour)

SATURDAY, 9TH – 10:00 AM “SEMINOLE REST SHORELINE CLEAN-UP” – Join a park ranger and help keep our National Parks trash free. Dress to get wet. Bring water shoes, gloves, water and sunscreen. Trash bags will be provided. Meet at the Seminole Rest parking area (210 River Rd., Oak Hill). (1 hour)

SATURDAY, 16TH – 8:00-11:00 AM “PLAYALINDA INTERNATIONAL COASTAL CLEAN-UP” – Once a year all over the world, millions of volunteers, who love the ocean and want to protect it, take this day to really make a difference. The seashore provides important habitat for many species who will benefit from clean-up efforts such as sea turtles and sea birds.
