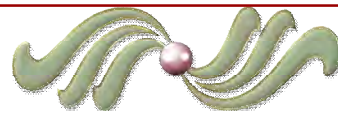

SELF CPR WHEN YOU ARE ALONE

Without help, the person whose heart is beating improperly and beginning to feel faint, has only 10 seconds left before losing consciousness. However, victims can help themselves by coughing repeatedly and vigorously. A deep breath should be taken before each cough, and the cough must be deep and prolonged, as when producing sputum from deep inside the chest. A breath and a cough must be repeated about every 2 seconds without let up until help arrives or until the heart is felt to be beating normally again. Deep breathes get oxygen into the lungs and coughing movements squeeze the heart and keep the blood circulating. The squeezing pressure on the heart also helps it regain normal rhythm. In this way, heart attack victims can get to the hospital.

President's Message



Most of our friends from up north have departed for home, every one promising to return when their weather turns for the worse. We'll miss them, but most will be returning when they find the time is right. I ran across an article that I thought would be of interest for all of you. It deals with how to detect stroke in a person. If for any reason you suspect the possibility of a person having a stroke, you have up to three (3) hours to get that person to a hospital for treatment before it is too late. The four signs to look for are: Ask the person to SMILE. The next test is to ask the person to repeat a SIMPLE SENTANCE (i.e. how are you today?). Next ask the person to RAISE BOTH ARMS, then ask to LOOK AT THE TONGUE. If it is crooked and the person has failed any of these tests, then that person should be taken to the hospital ASAP. Knowing this, and using it when you suspect a stroke victim, you may very well save a person's life.

Things are generally in good shape at the center. Many new activities are on the drawing board and the Board of Directors are becoming more active in providing new ideas for making your use of the center an enjoyable and pleasant one. With the summer coming on, we will not have as many people attending our activities, but those who do participate will have a great time. Again, if there is any activity you would like to have at the NBSC, just tell our Operations Managers or any board member and we will try our best to see that it is acted on.
