

Unexpected Rip Off-

I had just finished modifying my 20 year old Rans S-12. The idea was to add a full length windshield to divert the airflow up and over my head in an effort to make the plane more comfortable to fly.



About a year ago, the Rotax 503 engine (52 HP) was replaced with a Viking 90 HP. This increase in power presented a welcomed boost in performance, but the increased force of the wind in my face gave me a reason to buy the parts and start the conversion to a full length windshield. I picked up the parts at the RANS factory last summer on our flight back from Oregon.

When I completed the work, I was looking forward to the first flight. The weather was a little bumpy on November 5^{th} , but good enough to fly.

I secured my moto-cross type face protection (which includes goggles and a plastic covering over my microphone) on to my leather helmet and buckled the helmet under my chin. This is a pusher aircraft, so it is critical that nothing come loose in flight which would hit the propeller.

I taxied out and advanced the throttle, which now provides impressive acceleration and a leap off the ground. Climbing out rapidly, I noticed that the airflow was no longer directly in my face, but coming around both sides of the windshield and into the "cabin".

I leveled off and the airspeed increased rapidly to 70 mph. Then it happened – my face mask flipped up into my eyes as if ripped off by someone grabbing it from the bottom. I could not see because the top of the goggles was pushing against my eyes. A battle began as I held the control stick with my left hand and tugged at the face shield elastic strap with the other. After a few tries, I managed to pull the strap down on each side far enough to hold the face mask in place.

I headed back to land and found that if I lifted my chin or sat forward closer to the windshield the mask would again pull off. I landed safely and began to evaluate what had happened.

An area of low pressure - suction - was created behind the new windshield by the airflow over and around it. It would not be possible for me to fly the plane this way.



To solve the problem, I had to add half doors to the side of the windshield to deflect the flow to the rear. Now I don't need a helmet or face shield. I flew the plane to the Deland Expo for the Viking Engine display. The weather was horrible. I had to fly at 700 feet to stay below the clouds – but the new windshield/door combination kept me dry and a bit warmer.
