This month’s members and friends spotlight is on Joe Marshall:



Joe was born in Washington, DC in 1937, one of four children.

His Dad worked as a cook on the railroad, often working the route from New York to Birmingham and Miami. His job was considered essential by the government; as a result, he was not drafted into military service during WWII. His Mom was a registered nurse and also worked driving a cab – which often involved transporting patients.

At the age of nine, he started his first job – a paper route. Later, in high school he participated in the rifle squad, swim team and football. He attended a vocational high school – so he already had valuable skills to share.

As soon as he graduated, he enlisted in the Navy and was sent to electrical school. In his Navy career, he shipped out on 2 different carriers and then a submarine. When he advanced to warrant officer, he worked a submarine tender, became proficient at loading ordnance and became a weapons officer.

Along the way, he had 2 sons and 2 daughters, all of whom now live in the Washington, DC area.



When it was time to retire from the Navy, he went to work for Bechtel in Oak Ridge, TN doing nuclear power plant construction work. During his time at Bechtel, he also got his college degree and got his private pilot license in 2001 – shortly after 9/11.

With Bechtel, he advanced to Vice President and eventually did a three-year tour in the Marshall Islands on Kwajalein Atoll as the logistics manager. After he left there, he retired *for about four days*, then went to work for the Department of Energy, in Oak Ridge, as a project manager.

While at Bechtel, he purchased a Mooney but had to leave it hangered while he was on Kwajalein. When he returned, he sold it for a Bellanca Viking, which he eventually donated to Pilots for Christ, when he bought his current plane: Cherokee N8245N.

Joe had decided that cold weather was not for him. He came to Florida through a realtor connected to a Kwajalein friend. He found his home when introduced to the Indian River Country Club.

He is involved in several endeavors: three EAA chapters, an associate member of the Tuskegee Airmen, the Cancer Society, the Red Cross, and often organizes and runs golf tournaments to benefit charity.

I asked him about the best times in his life and he responded “I loved to work”. Whether it was the Navy, Bechtel or the DOE – he loved all the jobs he had! How many people would say that? Joe Marshall: another interesting, multitalented, EAA member!
