



NASA CAUSEWAY BRIDGE UPDATE: Work continues on the westbound span of the new NASA Causeway Bridge where SR 405 crosses the Indian River Lagoon, connecting with Kennedy Space Center and Cape Canaveral. In June 2023, the eastbound bridge was opened to the public, a milestone completion for this project. The westbound bridge is currently scheduled to open early spring of 2025.

- Phase 3: A sketch plat is under review for 75 single-family homes.







onstruction continues on Titusville Resort and Destination as the project progresses into phase 2. Currently, underground utilities and storm water retention are being installed on the property, along with basic infrastructure.

The construction is part of an initiative to turn the former Titusville Mall into a bustling town center, featuring a six-story, 153-room Cambria hotel, a seven-story apartment complex featuring 240 apartments, a clubhouse, and a courtyard pool, a six-story building consisting of 100 independent senior assisted living facilities and 20,000 square feet of retail space, two out parcel restaurants, and 110,000 square feet of retail, office, and medical space.



"With this project, we're expecting at least 2,000 people coming to town," says Jesse Wright, CEO of California Retail Properties Corp. "The project will contribute about 1,500 jobs to the community between construction and the multiple phases of the project, including restaurants, the hotel, apartments, and the service industry."

While work continues on the first half of the project, the second portion of the property remains open for business for several current tenants, including the new Titusville Indoor Flea Market.

DREAM Space Coast

ork continues on DREAM Space Coast, the luxury apartment complex located at 2825 S. Washington Ave. Situated along the Indian River Lagoon across from Kennedy Space Center, the 182-unit, two-tower, multifamily complex was initially constructed during the mid-1960s space industry boom leading to the Apollo moon missions. Over the years, it has changed names and owners and has

endured its share of woes. Now, in 2024, great strides have been taken to totally transform the property.

The two multifamily towers at Dream Space Coast, spanning six stories each, offer a range of apartments, including studios, one-bedroomone-bath, and two-bedroom-two-bath, furnished and unfurnished apartments. Most units provide unobstructed views of space launches, ensuring that residents can continue participating in the region's rich space history.



Renovations continue on the North Tower, and residents are already leasing apartments on the south side of the property. Amenities include a pool, conference room, yoga & Pilates studio, and fitness center.

HONORING OUR HEROES

American Police Hall of Fame Plans Major Growth this Year.



long the Indian River Lagoon, just west of the Kennedy Space Center, the American Police Hall of Fame and Museum (APHF) stands as a steadfast reminder of the sacrifices made by those who choose to wear the badge and protect their communities. These hallowed grounds will

undergo major changes over the next few years as the museum invests over \$55 million into projects that include a complete make-over of the existing facility, as well as the addition of three new buildings, and high-tech innovations to help tell the police officers' story.

BIG PLANS

The Police Hall of Fame is preparing a major site plan for city approval. The plan includes an 8,500-square-foot Welcome Center, a 6,500-square -foot, world-class Training Center, and a 25,000-square-foot class A Convention Center capable of seating over a 1,000 people, complete with a full kitchen. The site plan also includes a 10-story monument dedicated to law enforcement past, present, and future.

The new buildings and monument will create a beautiful park setting to be known as Infinity Rose Park. The park is named after the infinityshaped monument and blue rose perched at the top which is the basin for the "eternal flame" that will be lighted 24/7.

The existing facility known as the Police Hall of Fame will be totally changed and transformed into a visitor experience called the ILEX. The ILEX, immersive law enforcement experience, will be a very highly immersive technological experience with virtual rides and augmented reality while also incorporating full size components. Phase One of the ILEX is scheduled to begin in November 2024 with a completion date of May 2025.

INFINITY FLAME MONUMENT

The center piece of the park will be the Infinity Flame monument previously known as the United States Law Enforcement Eternal Flame.

This work of art will stand 120 feet tall and will be shaped in the form of the infinity symbol. Special nightly ceremonial lighting activities will take place each and every evening. The monument will feature ultra hi-technologies that will allow holographic imagery and spectacular light shows.

ADDITIONAL FEATURES

The Welcome Center is designed to be a two-story structure with upgraded exhibitory, state-of-the-art displays, rooftop dining, and


A helipad is already built and helicopter aerial tours are scheduled to begin in December with rides starting at \$19.99 per person.

Construction is being handled by RUSH Construction and the entire park is planned to come online in May of 2027. Architecture and master planning for the Infinity Rose Park and the ILEX are provided by Eleven-18, CPH Corp, and BaseMint Creative Services in Orlando. All have major theme park experiences.



EARLY HISTORY

Founded in 1960, APHF originally opened in North Port, Florida (Sarasota County), in a modest 3,500-square-foot building under the name "National Police Hall of Fame." It was the nation's first national law enforcement museum and memorial dedicated to officers killed in the line of duty.



In 1988, in collaboration with the National Association of Chiefs of Police, APHF acquired a three-story building in Miami, which had once served as an FBI complex. A few years later, the museum relocated to its permanent home in Titusville, now housed in a 50,000-square-foot

Over time, the collection grew, showcasing vehicles from across the country, historical weapons, and law enforcement tools, alongside the ever-increasing number of names on the memorial wall. Today, it offers more than a glimpse into history; it provides essential support to the families left behind by fallen officers.

A HALL OF HONOR

At the heart of the museum is the 2,000-square-foot Memorial, featuring marble panels inscribed with the names of over 10,000 law enforcement officers who have been killed in the line of duty since 1961. The centerpiece of the room is an American flag draped over a large marble block dedicated to unknown peace officers. Encircled by flowers and wreaths, this solemn display is overseen by a bronze statue of a police officer standing with two small children, symbolizing the sacrifice made by the officers' families.





CITY WEBSITE POISED FOR EXCITING UPDATES





Fall/Winter Irrigation Schedule Begins Nov 3.



n estimated 50 percent of all homeowners over-water their yards. Are you one of them? One way to keep from over-watering is to follow the irrigation restrictions established by the City of Titusville and St. John's River Water Management District.

Most homes and businesses have automated, in-ground irrigation systems. These systems use 47 percent more water than non-automated, above ground systems. Unfortunately, owners of these systems frequently suffer from "Set It and Forget It Syndrome," and often don't realize their systems need to be adjusted for weather and change in seasons.

On November 3 we return to Eastern Standard Time. The fall and winter irrigation schedule during Eastern Standard Time limits irrigation to one day per week. Yards or businesses within the St. Johns River Water Management District fall under these state restrictions. Titusville echoes these restrictions, including restrictions on reclaimed water.

Florida's irrigation schedules mimic nature. In the fall and winter there is less rain, less sunlight, and cooler weather. Your irrigation needs are also less during this time of year. Follow the steps below to reduce your irrigation and increase your irrigation efficiency.

Follow the irrigation schedule. Do not irrigate if your yard does not need it or if it has rained.

Group plants by watering needs and put them in the same zone. Plants and plant beds should be in different zones from turf.

Match all the sprinklers heads in each zone. Mismatched and

inappropriate sprinkler heads lead to dead spots and overspray.

Check spray angles. Misdirected sprinklers irrigate the street and sidewalk, not your lawn. Large arcs gets lost to evaporation and never reach your lawn.

Use micro-irrigation heads or drip irrigation for plant beds.

Irrigation restrictions apply to the use of city water, well water, & reclaimed water.

HURRICANE DEBRIS REMOVAL



Crews are hard at work removing debris left over from Hurricane Milton. Thanks to our in-house solid waste department, we are able to respond to hurricane debris removal quickly and efficiently.

BAFFLE BOXES INSTALLATION




Baffle Boxes were recently installed at Riverfront Center as part of an \$893,215 grant, which treats 202 acres of water. The boxes are capable of removing over 679 pounds of TN per year, and 160 pounds of TP per year.

SMOKE TESTING COMPLETE



Smoke Testing was completed with \$200,00 in grant funding from SOIRL. This project helps protect the Indian River Lagoon by identifying sources of ground water intrusion into the sewer system.

CITY GATEWAYS



A contract has been awarded to Earthscapes Unlimited, Inc. of Coleman, FL to landscape the city's gateways at I-95 & SR-406, and I-95 & SR-50.

Fertilizer Blackout Period Ends in Titusville.



Titusville's annual fertilizer blackout period, which begins on June 1 and runs through the summer months, has ended as of September 30. Now fertilizers containing nitrogen and/or phosphorus can once again be applied to lawns with some exceptions, such as when heavy rain is likely (for example a bad storm or hurricane), or if the property is within 25 feet of the Indian River Lagoon.

DID YOU

Per Florida State Statue section 316.130 (9) (a) (paraphrased) the lighted/signal pedestrian crosswalks require motorists to stop for crossing pedestrians when activated and a vehicle may not overtake a stopped vehicle that is allowing pedestrian in the crosswalk to cross. Failure to comply, could result in a traffic citation up to \$169.00.

The information on the posted sticker informs members of fire and police departments if there are pets inside the home. When this sticker is posted, responders will have immediate knowledge about animals inside the home, allowing for a more educated and effective response.

"For over a decade our agency has provided safety messages by way of social media, public service announcements and community outreach

events via our Pet Safety Advocate, "Milo", said Titusville Police Chief John Lau. "This free public outreach will continue "Milo's Mission" of providing animal safety awareness...we just love our community!", added Lau.

Holiday Smoke Alarm Safety

s the holiday season approaches, our homes become filled with extra activities like cooking large meals, decorating, lighting candles, and having overnight guests. By taking a few simple precautions, you can protect your home and loved ones during this festive time:

- Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, inside bedrooms, and outside sleeping areas.
- Test alarms monthly to ensure they are working properly.
- Replace alarms every 10 years or as recommended by the manufacturer.
- Choose flame-resistant decorations: Make sure decorations are labeled "flame-resistant" or "flame-retardant." This is especially important for artificial trees, wreaths, and garlands.
- Use flameless, battery-operated candles whenever possible.
 If you do use real candles, place them in sturdy holders and keep them away from flammable items like curtains, trees, or wrapping paper. Always extinguish candles before leaving the room.
- Check your holiday lights for frayed wires, broken bulbs, or other damage before use. Don't overload electrical outlets and use extension cords rated for indoor or outdoor use as appropriate. Turn off lights when you go to bed or leave the house.\
- Christmas Trees: Real vs. Artificial
- Keep the real Christmas trees watered. Make sure your tree stand is filled with water daily. A fresh, well-watered tree is much less likely to catch fire.
- Keep your tree at least three feet away from fireplaces, space heaters, and heat vents.
- Artificial trees, especially those labeled "fire-resistant," can be a safer option, but they still require caution, particularly if they come with built-in lights.
- Home Escape Plan Make sure your exits are not blocked by holiday decorations. Make sure guests know all possible exits and escape routes.

hile Hurricane Milton approached the state on Wednesday, October 9, the City of Titusville was already gearing up for what meteorologists were classifying as a potentially catastrophic event. City leadership, including City Manager Scott Larese and Fire Chief John Hustoles, the city's Emergency Manager, officially activated Titusville's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) at 8am that day, calling in key members of the local government to coordinate and manage city functions from a secure location throughout the storm.

The center, located inside Titusville's Fire Department Headquarters across from City Hall, was operational through Thursday afternoon, and functioned as the command hub and living quarters for core employees from select departments. Throughout the night, EOC members worked diligently to monitor the storm's track, ensure public safety, keep communications open with county and state EOCs, and coordinate recovery efforts once the storm passed.
