Self Guided Hike

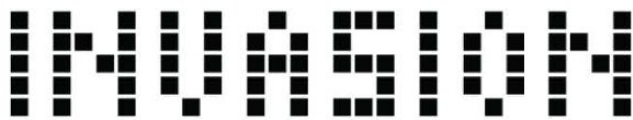
Saturday, May 25th, 10:00am-12:00pm

Wednesday, May 29th, 10:00am-11:00am

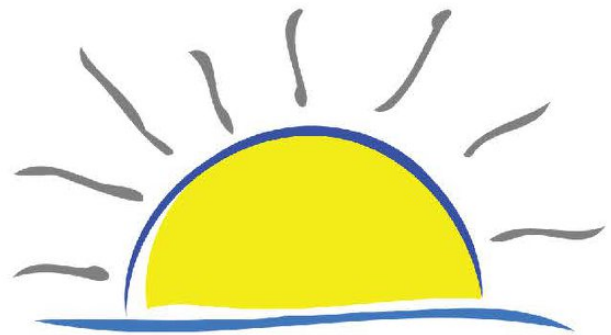
Summer vacation! But what to do with the kids... Grab the kids and head to the Sams House for a cool summer craft.
