Mango Harvest Festival Set for June 24

We will have a Mango Harvest Festival at the Sams House Nature Center, on Sat., June 24 from 10 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

Guests can enjoy live demonstrations of mango recipes like dehydrated mangos, green pickled mangos, mango salsa, sauteed mangos, mango sorbet and more. Following the demonstrations, guests will be invited for a taste sampling. To reserve a seat and purchase a \$5 ticket for the recipe demonstrations, please call 321 449-4720.

Mangos and mango related delicacies including jams, hot sauces, and baked goods will be available for purchase.

We're planning for live music entertainment. Brevard Tropical Fruit Club members will be available to answer questions regarding different mango species. Mango related raffle baskets and other items will be featured on the front porch of the main house.

The festival was inspired by the heritage of the Pioneer Sams family who were successful citrus and fruit (pineapple) and sugar cane growers in the late 1800s.

Everyone is excited to have the Mango Harvest Festival again this year. We had one in 2021 which was a huge success, but last year cold and wind stopped all the trees on Merritt Island from producing a mango crop. So far mango crops are looking good. Hope to see you there on Saturday, June 24!

Sabre-toothed Cat Has Arrived



A new exhibit has arrived at the Sams House Nature Center. A sabre-toothed cat, which is in the family of Smilodons (knife tooth), once roamed southern and central North America during the Pleistocene epoch 2 million – 10,000 years ago. Fossil occurrences have been found in Brevard County making this saber-tooth cat a great addition to the ice age exhibit around the educational loop at the Sams House Nature Center. Also planned, is replacement of the current glyptodon with a new lifesize one for the exhibit. The sabretoothed cat, which was funded by our Preservation Society, will be installed in early summer.

The Space Coast Audubon Society (SCAS) has been partnering with the Sams House EEL Naturalists for the past several months.

In March EEL staff hosted a Bee Workshop, and in April they hosted a Wildlife Photography Workshop. On April 29th, Chelsea Miller from the SCAS copresented an iNaturalist workshop with Shannon Steele, EEL Naturalist, and afterward, attendees enjoyed a small bird hike led by Rob Lane, EEL Naturalist, to the magical strangler fig. We called it magical because the fig tree had fruit on it and hundreds of birds were feeding and making their sounds including Cedar Waxwings, Blackpoll Warblers, and Cape May Warblers. Birds not commonly seen here.


